HOW TO APPLY FOR SUMMER CAMP JOBS:

- 1. Submit a completed Recreation Oak Bay summer application form (attached) and resume to:

Applications must be received by 4pm, Wednesday, March 18, 2020.

- 2. Applicants will be considered for all positions for which they qualify. If you only want to be considered for specific positions, please indicate on the application form.
- 3. Late applications will be considered after all other qualified applicants are interviewed.
- 4. If shortlisted for an interview, applicants will be contacted by e-mail. Please ensure your e-mail address is clearly printed on the application form and please add humanresources@oakbay.ca to your safe list for incoming e-mails. We regret that we are only able to contact shortlisted applicants.
- 5. All shortlisted applicants (including current staff) must bring the required original certificates to be photocopied at interview night. You will not be considered for any position unless this paper work is received. If you do not have the necessary certification by interview night, proof of registration in the necessary certification is acceptable (certification must be completed prior to employment).
- 6. On request, applicants will be required to provide an original Criminal Record check dated within one year. (Please check with your local police station or RCMP to get the details on obtaining a Criminal Record check in your area.) Current staff- please check with Human Resources to see if your Criminal Record check will need to be renewed.



The Interview Process:

- 1. Applications must be submitted by 4pm on Wednesday, March 18, 2020.
- Shortlisted applicants will be contacted by e-mail during March 30 - April 3, 2020.

Interviews will be conducted April 7-9.

- Interviews will be approximately 2 1/4 hours in duration. The interview consists of a variety of written, group and practical stations – don't be nervous – the different modules allow us to see who you are and what you can do!
- 4. Team Leader candidates will be contacted for a second interview to be held April 16-17.
- 5. Successful applicants will be offered positions by e-mail April 22-May 22.
- Training weekend will be held at Windsor Pavilion and Oak Bay Recreation Centre for all summer camp staff on Saturday, June 13 and Sunday, June 14. These are paid sessions and you **MUST** attend both days of training.

New staff will be required to attend a new staff orientation session on Wednesday, May 27 from 6:30-9:00pm. Additonal training will be mandatory, depending on department and will be held June 17 and 24, 2020.

- 7. Some positions require staff to be available for up to 15 hours of camp specific lesson planning and training in addition to the training weekend. These sessions will take place in early June and will be held in the evenings. Team Leaders will contact their staff to arrange times and dates.
- 8. All positions are Union–CUPE Local 374.

Camps at a Glance

Skidaddle Camp – a daily registered camp for 6-12 year olds featuring bus and walking out trips, swimming and water fun, theme days, games and creative activities.

- **Fine Arts Camps** Arts & Crafts, Theatre and Dance camps for 6-14 year olds that include approximately 15 hours of instruction per week working toward a performance for parents and campers each Friday, plus games, crafts and outdoor activities.
- **Summer in the Parks** outdoor-based camp that includes games, crafts, theme activities, swimming, water fun and walking out trips.
- Sports Camps in addition to other activities such as games and swimming, Sports (may include tee-ball, floor hockey, soccer, and other indoor/outdoor games) and Golf camps offer approximately 15 hours of instruction per week while Tennis Camps offer approximately 30 hours of instruction per week.
- **Theme Camps** weekly camps providing activities, out trips, games and crafts based on popular themes for preschool or school-age children.
- **Fun Unlimited** weekly half and full day camp that includes themes, crafts and outdoor activities.

Morning session includes swim lessons taught

by the Recreation Oak Bay Aquatics Department.

- **Aqua Adventures** out trip based camp focusing on aquatic recreational activities that may include skim boarding, kayaking, scuba diving and beach trips.
- **Before/After Camp** supervision for campers beyond regular camp hours. Includes drop off/pick up from camps plus games and creative activities.
- Junior Lifeguard Camp competitions, special events and activities while learning about lifesaving and lifeguarding.
- **Ocean Discovery/Lake Hoppers Camps** nature/outdoor camp that includes lots of time in, on, and around water.
- Youth Ultimate Outdoor Camp outdoor off location camp involving recreational activities such as kayaking, SUP, ziplining, bubble soccer, motorcross, paintball and swimming.
- **Tennis Camps** weekly half and full day camps that includes tennis, games and swimming.
- Camp/Driver (3 Positions) responsible for driving bus for camp out trips and being an extra leader on the out trip. (see page 4)
- NOTE: Camps do not run on statutory holidays unless noted.

Instructor Positions
